The Sweetness of Life Bakery offers unique, custom baked goods

January 2019, a talented Ho-Chunk Nation tribal member, Ashley Gerdes, officially opened a bakery that provides unique, custom baked goods. Her new business is named 'The Sweetness of Life Bakery.' She combined her baking skills with her artistic flair to become the owner and operator.

The bakery offers various cakes, cake pops, cupcakes, and cookies. Currently, the bakery is just a side business for Mrs. Gerdes and is based out of her and her husband's home in Melrose, Wisconsin.

Ashley Gerdes credits her grandmother, Marie Lewis, as being the catalyst to get her going.

"One year for Christmas, my Gaga (grandmother) got me a class at Michael's. They had a decorating class on how to decorate cakes, and it was a level one class," said Gerdes. "With this class comes a kit and a book on tips and tools. I feel that taking this class gave me the confidence to know I was pretty good at doing this."

Although Ashley Gerdes was in this class for fun, she took it seri-

ously and returned home with new tools to try. She purchased various tips for her bags and was inspired to continue practicing at home. Some months later, she began decorating cakes professionally.

Ashley said, "I've worked at Festival Foods as a cake decorator. I got to learn different tricks on how these girls were doing their cakes."

She learned how to use different airbrushing techniques and how to make a rainbow. "You literally only need two or three colors to make a rainbow with an airbrush," Ashley explained. She also explained how she furthered her talents, "I bake different things and watched a lot of YouTube videos of how to pipe a rose or how to do different things."

Ashley Gerdes, daughter of Michelle Cloud, also follows what's called a 'cookier' on Instagram. Gerdes explained that 'cookiers' provide tips and tricks on how to create different designs on cookies. Some 'cookiers' also provide tutorial videos.

"I feel like someone I really love on Instagram, her name is Braidi, and she lives in Nevada. She owns her own business called 'The Frosted Cookery.' She was the first page that I followed on Instagram of a 'cookier.' She has a bunch of vid-

eos on how to do different things: how to make flowers; how to flood a cookie; how to airbrush; and (explains) all the products she uses," said Ashley. "This girl is legit! I was getting stuff she uses and trying stuff she does. I feel like she was my cookie inspiration lady."

Another inspiration came from Ashley's brother, Dr. Marcus Lewis. He planted the name of Ashley's bakery in her head. Dr. Lewis was speaking at Native American Church prayer services at the District 1 Community Center when the idea was mentioned.

"We were about to eat or something. He was talking about all this food that was out, and he starts talking about the cake that was there. He's like, 'we've always grown up with the teaching that the cake represents the sweetness of life' and I really thought about that for a long time," Gerdes said. "I had some different ideas of different names that I could call my bakery. I just kept coming back to 'The Sweetness of Life' and it kind of ties into our Ho-Chunk culture, well Native American Church."

Ashley Gerdes discussed her idea with her husband, Kenny Gerdes, after the prayer services. She was excited to take off with the idea. Ashley located a girl on Etsy to draft and design 'The Sweetness of Life Bak-

ery' logo.

Gerdes then went on to create a Facebook page for the bakery where she only invited her friends and family. At first, she just used it to show her brother or her sister a cake for their birthdays. In the beginning, the page only had 87 – 100 people. Ashley credits word of mouth for getting her products out there.

"I feel like my best product is my sugar cookie. They are so unique. I feel like they'd be a great addition to any birthday party," said Ashley, the granddaughter of the late Walter Lewis.

Gerdes went on to explain, "My chocolate cake is the

Kenny Gerdes' grandmother is Sandy Gerdes.



The convention was an opportunity to learn new techniques in the ever-changing world of journalism, to make

connections and renew old ones, and to honor the winners of the annual Better Newspaper Contest.

This year, Hocak Worak reporter Ken Luchterhand was honored with a first-place award for Feature (non-profile) writing for his September 29, 2017, article "Deputy makes a hoop dream come true for children."

Also, Luchterhand received

an honorable mention in Local Education Coverage for "Newly-formed club, Indigenous Students United, to help students with culturally-sensitive issues"; "Youth learn about culture and tradition at annual summer camp"; and "School mural created to emphasize the inclusion of all people."

The recognitions were presented during the Better Newspaper Awards Banquet on Thursday evening.

Many seminars throughout the two days allowed attendees to improve their writing, investigation, social media, and photography skills.


At noon on Friday, participants could attend the Student Honors Luncheon in which Gov. Tony Evers gave encouragement to those professionals in the journalism field.

On Wednesday, March 13, Blackdeer was sworn-in by County Commander David Hale at the Jackson County American Legion monthly meeting. Post 129 hosted the

meeting.

Blackdeer is the son of Betty and the late Randall Blackdeer. He and his wife, Rosa, have a son, Randall III, and a daughter, Isabel.

Previous Commander Jes-sika Greendeer asked Blackdeer if he would take over the duties as commander and his nomination to the position was approved at the January meeting.

Blackdeer served in the U.S. Air Force from 2002 to 2010. He was stationed at Lackland Air Force Base in San Antonio, Texas, and then at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Dayton, Ohio. Blackdeer was deployed to Iraq once for four months, and twice for six months each.

By profession, Blackdeer is a Ho-Chunk language instructor, teaching high school freshmen and also instructs online community classes. He was an apprentice for three years and has advanced to an instructor, developing materials and refining teaching skills.

In his duties as American Legion commander, he will

preside over meetings and will be the main point of contact, getting people together for various appearances and functions. His duties are to create and oversee a budget and to organize the annual Memorial Day Powwow in Black River Falls.

In addition, he manages the upkeep of the Post 129 building and is the contact for renting it out for various events and functions.

He knows that he's one of the younger veterans, issuing in another generation of legionnaires. The job ahead is to recruit the younger people, which is a lot of work, he said. He plans to conduct a recruiting drive to gain more

members.

However, a recent report shows that the county American Legion is successful, having met its goal of 80 percent membership of veterans in the county.

"We're sitting in a good spot," Blackdeer said.

"I'm proud to keep the traditions of Legion going," Blackdeer said.

His father was a veteran and a member of the American Legion. His grandfather was a veteran in World War II and was a Code Talker.

"We have a lot of military in the family," he said. "I'm proud to be a member but to be the commander is overwhelming pride."

advance notice.

Customers can submit orders via her website or Facebook page. She would like customers to include their name, email address, telephone number, date of party, number of people serving, type(s) of product (cake, cupcake, cake pops, or cookies), and theme with their orders.

Her cell phone number is listed on her Facebook page for those who wish to text or call her.

Mrs. Gerdes said, "I do not have help right now, it's just me. I think that's one thing that people really have to understand is I am only one person. Literally, I'm the baker, the decorator, and the cleanup

crew."

In addition to that, she is a mother, has a full-time job, updates her bakery's Facebook page, manages her bakery's website, takes her own photographs, and is her own accountant. She is working on a price list for publication.

Ashley appreciates and acknowledged that her husband helps out at home. She feels like a tornado went through her kitchen after completing an order and Kenny helps reorganize. He also offers suggestions like stenciling and airbrushing their logo on the baked goods bags because the logo stickers keep falling off.

"My ultimate dream is to own my own business and

work for myself, doing what I am truly passionate about," said Ashley, who has a Business Management Associate Degree from Western Technical College.

She credits her family and her husband for fully supporting her goals. Ashley appreciates homeownership because it provided her enough workspace to create her products.

People have the opportunity to purchase and sample her cookies. Ashley Gerdes is having a pop-up sale in the Tribal Office Building in Black River Falls on Thursday, April 18th. She will be selling Easter cookies starting at 8:00 AM in the atrium. Gerdes explained she is just



trying to get her name out there, get people to try cookies, and get feedback.

"Hopefully that goes well, and I'm looking forward to that," said Ashley.

Future Ho-Chunk Museum hosts yarn belt weaving class

The future Ho-Chunk Museum opened its doors to the public for the very first time on Saturday, March 9, to host a cultural class. The building is located on 1108 Superior Avenue downtown Tomah, Wisconsin. Community members stopped in throughout the day for a sneak preview of the space and participated in a

yarn belt weaving class.

Museum Director Josephine G. Lee has been working on introducing the Ho-Chunk Museum and looks forward to continuing to expand the project.

“I wanted to host some classes because that’s really what heritage and preservation has been working towards is creating open learn-

ing environments, and we have the space,” Lee said.

“I’m hoping to do a (deer) hide class here, paaxge, some wood carving, spoons, and bowls. A little bit of everything.”

Bonnie Bird was asked to help teach the yarn belt weaving class.

“I’m always more than happy to share what I know. I love teaching others because I know that weaving is kind of a lost art, and not very many people know how to do it,” Bird said.

Bonnie Bird went on to explain, “When I was growing up, and when I wanted to know something, it wasn’t a big secret. It was always like ‘yes come learn, someone needs to know this’ and so when it comes to our cultural arts and helping other people retain that knowledge, I’m always going to share that information. I enjoy it!”

According to Josie Lee, sharing knowledge and helping Ho-Chunk people learn

how to weave a yarn belt goes beyond preserving the craft.

“It is really helping to have people to connect with their identity. And some ways that people do that is learning something new and something tangible - they can say that makes them Ho-Chunk and they can pass that on,” Lee said.

Josephine Lee requested ideas, “I’m trying to find ways to explain who we are as Ho-Chunk people to not just other tribal members, but to the community at large. And if people have ideas of what they want to see, what is core to being Ho-Chunk throughout our story, I’d love ideas - what they want to see, what they don’t want to see.”

Christina Blaschke sets sights on world travel with 'Up With People'

Christina Blaschke has the chance of a lifetime. She's going to take that chance and make the best of it.

She signed up to join the group "Up With People," an organization that travels throughout the country and even to other countries.

Christina, 18, is the daughter of Cori and David Blaschke, Tomah. She has a younger brother, Noah.

She will graduate in May from Tomah High School and then begin her journey in July, having signed up for one year service to "Up With People."

She had heard the tales of her mother being involved with "Up With People," but her first direct exposure was when she had the opportunity to perform with the teen cast. At a reunion of former members, the children of those members were able to get on stage to perform.

In school, she has some background in performing. She has sung at school and made speeches.

"I always loved music – singing and dancing – and the arts," she said. Christina had such a fun time with the teen cast, she decided to join the organization.

They stay with host families in each state or country. They visit schools, talk to students, and perform com-

munity service at each stop. Later they perform on stage their singing and dancing. They each have to pay their own way and work to receive donations.

"In July I will start with staging in Denver. We will rehearse and then do our first show before heading on the road to several states, then several countries," Christina said.

When she was accepted into the program, she was placed into one of the four available groups: Cast A, B, C, and D. She was placed into "Cast B," with whom she will be traveling and performing the entire year of her service.

There are examples of the organization's work on YouTube videos.

"The songs have meanings – social messages," she said.

Christina said her influence in making the decision to join "Up With People" is her mother, Cori.

"Our family hosted 'Up With People' cast members in 1977 in Hawaii. I was only three at the time, but I grew up listening to their music," Cori said. "I got accepted into the program my senior year of high school and travelled with them from July 1992 to July 1993."

Cori's cast was made up of about 150 members from around 25 different countries, travelling throughout the United States, Europe, and Canada.

"The community service we did in each city was very impactful for me," Cori said. "I got to spend time with kids from Sarajevo who were living in a refugee camp in the Netherlands and worked in an animal rehabilitation center in Sweden," Cori said.

"I learned leadership skills as I went ahead of the cast and did promotion work in Antwerp, Belgium. The experience changed my perspective on the world and the responsibility we each have to make it better for those around us and across the seas," she said.

"I was in choir and theater in high school, but the main reason I wanted to join 'Up With People' was for the experience through learning from those around me in the cast and host families; as well as, through community service," Cori said.

Christina wants to go pre-med in college, so her mother suggested she take a gap year to experience this program.

"It would open up the world to her in ways that will benefit her throughout her life and career. I want her to enjoy her youth and learn life lessons that she couldn't learn in a classroom," Cori said. "Both my husband and I are very protective of our kids, probably overly so, and are nervous for her to leave the nest. But I know the impact it will have on her and am so proud that she is taking the big

step to leave home to experience the world."

As the day grows near for her to leave, Christina said there will be no hesitation to go.

"I'm a little nervous," she said, "but I'm more anxious to get going and meet new people. I don't like being stuck in one place too long."

Frequently asked questions regarding Indian Wills and the importance of estate planning

What is a Will?

A will is a legally binding document that addresses how your named assets (belongings, bank accounts, land, etc.) will be distributed at your death. Another purpose of a will, along with naming who will receive your assets, is to name an executor. An executor of a will is the person who will assist with the administration of your estate. Note: You must be an Indian 18 years of age or older and capable of disposing your Trust/Restricted Indian property by will.

What is the meaning of "Probate"?

Probate is a legal process by which a judge determines who will receive your property after you die according to State, Tribal, and/or Federal law.

What do they call people who are involved in a probate or a will?

- Decedent – this is the legal term for the person who died.
- Devisee – person who receives property under a will.
- Testator/Testatrix – person who makes a will. Properly, a man is a testator and a woman is a testatrix.

How long does probate take?

Depending on the nature of your estate, the process

can last anywhere from a few months for a simple estate up to a couple years for more complex estates. This is another purpose of a will – to be as detailed and thorough as possible in naming beneficiaries so that this process can be as short as possible.

What is "Trust" or "Restricted Indian Property"?

Real or personal property where title is held by the United States government for the benefit of an individual Indian or an Indian tribe. Typically, title to this property cannot be transferred to another person without the consent of the Secretary of the Interior or his/her authorized representative.

Who can prepare a will for me? Do I need an attorney to prepare it?

You will want to consult an attorney who is familiar with the laws of Indian Trust property. You may want to have them consult the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) for facts concerning your trust property.

Who can inherit my restricted Indian property?

We strongly encourage you to execute a will to pass trust property to your Indian heirs. Should a non-Indian inherit, it goes out of trust status and is subject to taxes. The process to attempt to return land interests to trust status is long and costly.

When preparing a will, you must identify the person to take property by the name, age/birth date, tribe and his/her relationship to you. You may want to identify alternate devisee(s) in the event your primary devisee(s) predecease you. If your chosen devisee(s) are non-Indians, this must be stated in your will.

Who inherits my property if I die without a will?

Real property is divided according to the laws of the State in which the land is located. Personal property is divided according to the laws of the State where the person resided.

Since my spouse and I have all our property in both of our names, do I still need a will?

Yes! Even though your spouse will get all your jointly held property upon your passing, it is still sound estate planning to have a will. A will covers unforeseen situations like the simultaneous death of you and your spouse or any additional property you may accumulate that is not jointly held. It is always advisable that both spouses have a will since you can never be certain which spouse will die first.

What if my spouse is a non-Indian?

If your spouse is a non-Indian, you may consider giving

a Life Estate, meaning your spouse has the right to use the property or receive any generated income for his/her lifetime. Full ownership would revert to the Indian heir(s) upon your spouse's death.

Can I disinherit a relative in my will?

In most states you cannot disinherit your spouse (the exception to this rule that applies specifically to Indian wills allows you to omit your non-Indian spouse in favor of the Indian heir(s) in order to keep the Indian land in trust status). You can disinherit any other relative, including children. You should expressly mention the relative you want to disinherit in your will.

What happens to my will once it is written?

The original will is stored at the Ho-Chunk Nation Register of Deeds Office in a locked vault/cabinet until needed. If you wish, a copy can be provided to you and should be maintained with your important papers. Your will is kept in absolute confidence and its existence will be revealed by the BIA only when we receive notice of your death.

Can I change or revoke my will once it is written?

You can change your will as often as you wish during your lifetime. You may revoke your will by writing a new will, destroying the old will or by executing a codicil

to your will. A codicil is a small supplement or addition to your will. If the devisee(s) are going to change, a new will should be executed.

Do my witnesses have to know what is in my will?

The law only requires that two witnesses, not related to you by blood or marriage or to any of your devisee(s), watch you sign and date the will and that they know you have said it is your will.

Do I have to use certain "legal" language in my will?

There is no specific legal words required to make a will valid. It is, however, important to use simple, clear, and straightforward language.

Is there anything else I might want to know about making a will?

A person must be mentally alert when he/she makes and signs a will. Age or physical condition is not a sign of incompetence. A person must also be free of undue influence, persuasion, or force when the will is made.

As you have heard, the Minors Trust was “restated” to help with government benefits and to defer taxes. Since this change occurred in the middle of the year, you still need to file a tax return for your children for 2018. You will not need to file a tax return for your children in 2019 or other future years, unless you receive a trust distribution. The table below shows the details.

All funds within the Minors Trust are being tracked to ensure that no money is taxed twice. You will only be taxed on new per capita contributed to the Minors Trust and new trust investment growth, but these taxes will not be owed until the time when the funds are actually distributed. This will be a great benefit for families because you will not need to do a tax return every year for your children. When these untaxed funds are eventually distributed from the trust, Providence will perform a tax withholding on these funds, very similarly to how the Nation has previously done when per capita funds were taxed at the time of contribution to the trust.

If you have not filed a tax return for previous years before 2018, you still need to file a tax return for those years. If you owe taxes for any of those years, you or your tax preparer can send a copy of the tax returns and the vouchers to Providence and your Minors Trust can pay those taxes owed and tax preparation fees.



3. Elections, c. Primary Election and Runoff Elections.

Chapter 1, Section 5. Elections. The Constitution prescribes two (2) types of elections: General Elections and Special Elections. When three (3) or more candidates run for a seat in a General or a Special Election, there shall be a Primary Election and if required a Runoff Election as described in Section 5, a. (3);

Any candidate who receives fifty percent (50%) plus one (1) of the total votes cast shall be deemed as winner.

REGISTRATION:

Each person seeking to vote must register at the polling place. If a person cannot write, that person must sign his/her name with a mark before two (2) witnesses. A Ho-Chunk translator will be available to assist any tribal member who requests assistance.

ELIGIBILITY DISPUTES:

Any individual whose name does not appear on the eligible voters list can claim the right to vote by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board. Any eligible voter may challenge the eligibility of an individual's name appearing on the eligible voters list by presenting a written challenge to the Election Board.

The Election Board will rule on all written challenges to the list of eligible voters immediately after the close of the challenge period. Section 11(c) iii, (Deadline Monday, May 15, 2019 at 4:00 pm).


